Completing anticipation guides helps students recognize and connect to themes that surface in their learning. Use this strategy at the beginning of a unit or before engaging with a text.

### Teaching Strategy: Anticipation Guides | Facing History

An anticipation guide is a type of graphic organizer used as a pre-reading, during reading, and post-reading activity to assess students' knowledge of a subject. By design, anticipation guides peak students' interest in a topic in a highly-engaging way.

Anticipation guides stimulate students' interest in a topic and set a purpose for reading. They teach students to make predictions, anticipate the text, and verify their predictions. They connect new information to prior knowledge and build curiosity about a new topic.

### Anticipation Guide - STRATEGIES

Anticipation guides will help students formulate their opinions about a text before jumping into it, then review and rethink their statements afterward. This will help their metacognitive abilities because they are forced to think about why they think a certain way.

Anticipation Guides (Herber, 1978) are typically a list of statements related to a topic that act as scaffolding for student understanding of the text. Students indicate if they agree or disagree with each of the statements.

### Anticipation Guides: Activating Prior Knowledge ...

Anticipation guides consist of statements about themes from a text and ask students to evaluate their own thoughts about those themes. Anticipation guides help students build background when they think about ideas before they engage in a text. The guide also helps students to identify and connect themes as they read the text.
