PHYSICAL EXAMINATION A complete physical examination is included as part of every Bright Futures visit. The examination must be comprehensive and also focus on specific assessments that are appropriate for the child's or adolescent's age, developmental phase, and needs. This portion of the visit builds on the history gathered earlier.

PHYSICAL EXAMINATION Examination of the infant and young child begins with observing him or her and establishing rapport. The order of the examination should fit the child and the circumstances. It is wise to make no sudden movements and to complete first those parts of the examination that require the child's cooperation.

PEDIATRIC HISTORY & PHYSICAL EXAM

The examination is often very difficult in infants and young children for several reasons. Babies and young children often cry during the physical examination, making auscultation difficult. The best opportunity for success lies in prewarming hands and instruments and the use of a pacifier to calm the infant.
