PHONOLOGY 5 - is concerned with how sounds function in relation to each other in a language. -is about patterns of sounds, especially different patterns of sounds in different languages, or within each language, different patterns of sounds in different positions in words etc. -describes the way sounds function within a given language or across languages to encode meaning. -is how speech sounds are organized and affect one another in pronunciation.
