The Province of the Transvaal (Afrikaans: Provinsie Transvaal), commonly referred to as the Transvaal (/ ˈ t r ə : n s v ə : l , ˈ t r æ n s - / ; Afrikaans: [ˈtransfɑ:l]), was a province of South Africa from 1910 until 1994, when a new constitution subdivided it following the end of apartheid.
