Psychosocial hazards are factors in the design or management of work that increase the risk of work-related stress and can lead to

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psychological or physical harm. Examples of psychosocial hazards might include poor supervisor support or high job demands. Employees are likely to be exposed to a combination of psychosocial hazards.

### **The Measures For Controlling Slip, Trip And Fall Hazards**

Long work hours and extended and irregular shifts may lead to fatigue and to physical and mental stress. Working extended shifts may also involve prolonged exposure to potential health hazards such as noise, chemicals, and others. These exposures could exceed established permissible exposure limits (PELs) or

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violate other health standards. ...

### **Long Work Hours, Extended or Irregular Shifts, and Worker ...**

Scope and application. This Code is intended to be read by persons conducting a business or undertaking (PCBU), usually an employer or business, and those who have duties under the WHS Act. It provides practical guidance on the process a PCBU could use to identify and to manage psychosocial hazards at work.

Physical hazards include activities or natural substances in a work environment that pose health risks. Extreme temperatures, poor air quality, excessive noise and radiation in the workplace can all harm workers, potentially causing respiratory problems, hearing loss and cancer, among other problems.

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Eliminate ergonomic hazards Good work design. Good work design is the most effective way to eliminate hazards as the process considers health and safety issues during the concept and planning phases. In these early stages you have the best chance to: design out hazards; effectively control risks; design in efficiencies.
